Additionally, under Hannah's supervision, CCK will now offer clinical hours for Nurse Practitioner students, providing valuable hands-on experience within the camp's supportive environment.







REACHING GREAT MILESTONES: 40,000 CAMPERS SERVED




A STORY TO REMEMBER
